SHARE OLD SPECTACLES (S.O.S.)



In 1967, in conjunction with Direct Relief International, Kiwanis Clubs started their eyeglass donation program.

Direct Relief International (DRI) is headquartered in Goleta, California and is a non-profit, non-sectarian, non-political organization providing medical donations to health facilities and health projects serving the needy in medically less - developed areas of the world. These areas include the United States, Latin America, Caribbean, Eastern and Central Europe, Middle East, Africa, Asia and the Pacific. They assist charitable hospitals, and health clinics that offer medical services and education to the needy. All recipients must agree to render service to anyone who requests medical care, regardless of religion, race, ethnic origin, political affiliation or ability to pay.

They provide pharmaceuticals, medical supplies, new and refurbished medical equipment, nutritional supplements, and used eyeglasses which have been screened and coded.

Direct Relief has been recognized as one of the nation's most cost-effective charitable organizations, spending less than 5% of all contribution on overhead.

I'm not sure how long Kiwaniannes have participated in this program, but I know when I deliver donated glasses to their facility (which earlier this month was over 200 pair), they are very appreciative of our contributions.
